

## **Jacksonville Antique Radio Society**

Minutes for meeting of 17 May 2010.

### Call to Order

Called to order at 7:30PM by Andy Rood. Pledge of Allegiance led by Andy Rood.

The treasurer's report was presented by Gerry Lukach. He mentioned that he had checked into whether we were required to file a 990-N tax-exemption form with the IRS, and found that we were not due to our small size.
